



WHY VISIT FIRENZUOLA?

Located in the upper valley of the Eterno River (Santerno), Firenzuola offers breathtaking landscapes spanning from the macigno stone quarries, so loved by Brunelleschi, to the blue waters of the Rovigo river that passes through the green Apennine woods. A pit stop in Firenzuola is a must if you are looking for an authentic encounter with nature.

Firenzuola has an ancient history; the first inhabitants were the Ligurian Mageli and the Umbrians. During the Middle Ages, the Republic of Florence defeated the Ubaldini coterie of the Lombard origins and founded the town by placing the first stone of the Castrum Florentiole in 1332. The walls are still partially visible today. However, little remains of the original town as, being close to the Gothic Line, it was destroyed by Second World War bombings. Reconstruction along the original perimeter began as soon as the war was over, but with modern architecture, flanking with futuristic structures the ancient Renaissance doors and the mighty fortress.
